SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD January 23, 2022

In the Apostolic Letter Aperuit Ellis, Pope Francis instituted the Sunday of the Word of God, which is celebrated on the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time (Today).

"Devoting a specific Sunday of the liturgical year to the word of God can enable the Church to experience anew how the risen Lord opens up for us the treasure of his word and enables ut to proclaim its unfathomable riches before the world." -- *Pope Francis, Aperuit Ellis, 2.*

SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading Nehemiah 8:2-4a,5-6,8-10 Ezra reads from the book of the Law and interprets it for all to understand. Responsorial Psalm Psalm 19:8,9,10,15 A song in praise of the Law of the Lord Second Reading 1 Corinthians 12:12-30 Paul explains that all were baptized into the one body of Christ. Gospel Reading Luke 1:1-4; 4:14-21

In the synagogue at Nazareth, Jesus reads aloud from the scroll of the prophet Isaiah and announces that this Scripture is now fulfilled.

Jesus was the one sent by God to bring salvation to the world. Jesus announced that mission using the framework we hear in today's Gospel from the prophet Isaiah: glad tidings will be brought to the poor, liberty to captives, recovery of sight for the blind, and freedom for the oppressed. Jesus inaugurates the Kingdom of God in his person—through his life, death, and Resurrection. We are charged with the task of continuing the mission that Jesus began. Jesus set the framework for all of us when he announced his ministry in today's Gospel. Jesus also gave us the helper we would need to enable us to participate in his mission. The Holy Spirit has been given to us so that we, the Church, might serve the Kingdom of God. (*Excerpt from Sunday Connection, Loyolapress*)

The Conversion of Saint Paul

Patron Saint of missionaries, evangelists, writers

In the long history of the Church no conversion has been more consequential than St. Paul's. Paul was an ardent persecutor of Christians before his blinding light experience on the road to Damascus. After his conversion, Paul undertook an energetic missionary tour to convert the Gentiles of the Roman Empire to Christianity. He founded many churches to whom he wrote letters, and which comprise much of the New Testament.

Paul's conversion teaches us that when Jesus come to us, He doesn't come alone. He comes with His angels, saints, priests, and bishops. He comes with Mary, the sacraments, doctrine, and devotions. He comes with the Church because he and the Church are one. And when we go to the Lord we don't go alone either. We go as members of a Church into whose mystical body we were baptized. Thus St. Paul heard from God Himself, and thus we believe today.

St. Paul, we ask your openness to conversion when we hear the Lord speak to us as He spoke to you. Assist us in responding with great faith to every invitation we receive to love the Lord more fully, to know Him more deeply, and to spread his word more broadly to those who need it.
