First Reading Jeremiah 17:5-8 Put trust and hope in the Lord, not in human beings.

Responsorial Psalm *Psalm 1:1-4,6* Blessed are those who follow the law of the Lord.

Second Reading

1 Corinthians 15:12,16-20 Our hope for resurrection is sure because Christ has been raised from the dead.

Gospel Reading *Luke 6:17,20-26* Jesus teaches the crowd the way to happiness.

Today's Gospel offers a contrast to many of the messages we hear in our society today. If we were to accept uncritically the "get ahead" messages of our culture, we would think that happiness means having money, being successful, and having many possessions. In this way, we are not unlike the people who heard Jesus teach on the day that he taught the Beatitudes. They too associated happiness with possessions and success. The report of the Beatitudes in Luke's Gospel, however, takes things one step further. Not only will we not find happiness through the "get ahead" messages of the world, but relying upon these messages will cause us harm. The warnings spoken are particularly challenging because they suggest that our way of life must change if we are to gain the lasting happiness of eternal life. (Lovola Press)



Countdown to Lent

As the season of Lent approaches, let us remind ourselves that Lent is a time for penance and repentance, for prayer and almsgiving, and for working to change attitudes that are not pleasing to God.

<u>March 2 is Ash Wednesday</u>. It is the beginning of Lent, which lasts 40 days and 6 Sundays. Following the Precepts of the Church, Ash Wednesday is a day of universal fasting and abstinence from meat. (Fasting obligation binds persons aged 18-59; the days of fast are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The abstinence obligation binds all those who are 14 and older, and is obligatory for all Fridays of Lent).



Dear Parishioners,

This past Friday was the World Day of the Sick, also it was the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes who appeared to St Bernadette in Lourdes, France and established this town as a major pilgrimage site for the sick and dying.

With this in mind, I would like to remind you that if you have a loved one in hospital who is seriously ill please do not delay in calling for the hospital priest chaplain to bring communion and the sacrament of the sick. This is an act of Charity toward your loved one allowing them to prepare themselves for a holy death.

During Covid there are many different restrictions different hospitals and hospital departments have implemented. The sooner you ask the nurse or the hospital spiritual office to have a Catholic priest attend the patient the sooner it can be worked out.

May Our Lady of Lourdes pray for our sick and dying loved ones.


