St. Thérèse of Lisieux, OCD, was born Marie Françoise-Thérèse Martin on January 2, 1873 is celebrating her 150th birthday this year.

Commonly referred to as the *"Little Flower of Jesus,"* St. Thérèse lived a very short life entering the cloistered Carmelite monastery of Lisieux at the age of 15 and was called home to God at the age of 24.

St. Thérèse's was beatified on April 29, 1923 by Pope Pius XI, Canonized on May 17, 1925.

St. Thérèse family members are also great sources of inspiration. Her parents, Saints Zélie and Louis Martin, were the first spouses to be canonized as saints by Pope Francis on October 18, 2015.
